

HIGHLICHT REEL: Antoine Winfield picked off Philip Rivers twice - once in the 2nd quarter to stop a drive in the red zone and the second at the end of the 3rd guarter that he returned for a TD to put the game out of reach for Durham.

- Trent Cole broke through for 3 sacks, 2 forced fumbles and was credited with 3 QB pressures. He also batted down a pass.
- David Akers kicked 3 field goals in 3 attempts, the longest from 46 yards.
- The Markham Defence forced 5 turnovers and held the Durham offence to just 2 trips inside the red zone.
- Thunder Lizard's receiver Calvin Johnson provided the lone Durham highlight with a 62-yard catch-and-run TD in the 3rd quarter.

EAME SUMMARY: The North Stars' defence set the tone on Durham's opening possession when off-season acquisition **Trent Cole** broke through the line and sacked *Philip Rivers*, forcing a fumble recovered by rookie, *Akeem Ayers* and giving Markham red zone possession at the 17 yard line. David Akers booted the first of three field goals from 33 yards to give the home team an early lead that they would never relinguish. Rivers was taken down in the backfield twice more by Cole on Durham's second possession, forcing a punt from deep in their end. Kenny Britt caught a 45-yard pass from Mark Sanchez on Markham's next possession, bringing his team to the Durham 8 yard line. Durham made a spirited goal line stand, stopping Joseph Addai on 4th down and inches at the goal line, but the Thunder Lizards' offence could not capitalize on the boost from their defence. A Durham march into the Markham red zone was halted by Antoine Winfield's first of two interceptions on the day and eventually led to Akers' second field goal. After falling behind 9-0 in the first half, Durham finally got on the board in the 3rd when Calvin Johnson took a medium pass across the middle 62 yards for a TD. It would be the lone high point for Durham. Five turnovers, including late "pick six" by Winfield from 34 yards, stymied Durham's offence and gave Markham a big win at the Dawg Pound.

- Drew Brees threw for 272 yards, including 4 throws of over 25 yards and 1 TD, to account for nearly all of Death Valley's total offence.
- Ray Lewis piled up 16 tackles and forced a fumble to lead the Undertakers' defence.
- Convicts' corner Agib Talib picked off Brees and returned it 55 yards for a TD to give Chino a temporary lead in the 4th quarter.
- Charles Johnson was a presence against the pass and the run, with 12 tackles, 2 stuffs, 1 deflection, 1 pressure and a forced fumble.
- Mario Manningham caught 6 passes for 109 yards, and a long of 52.

EAME SUMMARY: A struggle dominated by the defences ended up turning in favour of the Undertakers on a few big plays by their offence. A 47-yard pass from *Drew Brees* to *Devin Hester* on 3rd-and-long set up the opening points; a 49-yard field goal by John Kasay. The Convicts' defence ruled the field for the remainder of the first half and that allowed Jay Cutler the opportunity to engineer a pair of field goal drives that gave Chino a 6-3 lead heading into the locker room. However, the Death Valley defence was not so kind to Cutler in the second half, starting with an interception by Jason Allen on Chino's first possession. A 30-yard pass from Brees to Mario Manningham followed, setting up a 4-yard TD run by **Ryan Matthews** to give Death Valley a 10-6 lead. A field possession battle ensued for the rest of the 3rd guarter, with Chino finally winning the arm wrestle after a 53-yard drive set up Billy Cundiff from 44 yards out for his third field goal of the day. The Convicts would go on to take the lead in the 4th quarter when Aqib Talib picked off Brees and returned it 55 yards for a TD to make it 15-10 after a failed twopoint conversion attempt. Just two plays later, however, Brees hit Braylon Edwards in stride on a short slant and the Undertakers' wide receiver jetted 81 yards through the Convicts' secondary for the game-winning touchdown.

FIGHLIGHT REEL: LeSean McCoy rushed for 114 yards and 1 TD on 20 carries and added 33 yards receiving on 4 catches.

- Vince Young went 15 of 29 for 159 yards, 1 INT and 1 TD. He also ran for 74 yards and 4 1st downs on 9 carries.
- Jeremy Maclin had 6 receptions for 75 yards and 1 TD and kicker, Josh Brown booted 4 field goals.
- Mustangs' running back Matt Forte broke free for a 59-yard run that set up a 4th quarter field goal.
- Dustin Keller caught 9 balls for 128 yards and 1 TD.
- Matt Ryan attempted 41 passes, completing 23 for 239 yards, 1 INT and 1 TD.

GAME SUMMARY: Punters, Andy Lee and Sam Koch were the feature players in a 1st quarter controlled by the defences. The scoring began in the 2nd quarter after a 14-play, 73-yard drive by the Gladiators stalled in the red zone and **Josh Brown** broke the scoreless tie with a 32-yard field goal. Garland galloped back to take the lead on a 48-yard pass play to **Dustin Keller** that set up a 6-yard TD pass from **Matt** Ryan to Keller two plays later. The Glads marched back from their own 25 yard line to threaten at the Garland 9, but the Mustangs' defence held Vince Young out of the end zone on a scramble to the 2 yard line and forced consecutive in-completions to restrict Gwinnett to a field goal. Gwinnett's victory rally started with a Bryant McFadden interception of Ryan in the 3rd quarter. From the Garland 38, three runs by LeSean McCoy and a 15-yard facemask penalty to Fred Robbins finally put Gwinnett in the end zone and gave them a 13-7 lead. They extended that lead to 19-7 when Young capped their next drive with a 15-yard TD pass to Jeremy Maclin. A 59-yard run by Matt Forte set up a Garland field goal, then Leon Washington fumbled away the kickoff to set up a 1-yard TD run by Forte to put the Mustangs within 2 points, trailing 19-17. But they would get no closer. The Glads added two more field goals and stopped Garland on 4th and 20 with 2 minutes remaining to lock the win.

- Pickering defensive end, Ray Edwards made 3 tackles, notched a sack, stuffed a run and recorded 2 QB pressures.
- **Kevin Walter** had 8 catches for 109 yards and 6 first downs.
- Anguan Boldin led the Spartans with 7 catches for 63 yards and 1 TD.
- Cowtown defensive end, Aaron Kampman had 6 tackles, including 4 run stuffs.

GAMPE SUMMADEY: A 4th quarter interception return for a touchdown by Pickering cornerback, *Joe Haden* broke the tension of a close game and shot the Spartans into a commanding 20-10 lead with 7 minutes remaining. Haden followed up those heroics with the 'coup de grace,' forcing and recovering a Santana Moss fumble to shut down Cowtown's last reasonable chance at a comeback. Quarterback, *Matt Cassel* got off to a good start in his Pickering debut, completing 3 of 3 for 56 yards and a 20-yard TD pass to *Anquan Boldin* on his first possession to give Pickering an early 7-0 lead. Trailing 10-0 in the 2nd quarter, Cowtown's offence recovered from a poor start thanks to a 39-yard pass play to *Kevin Walter* that set up *Olindo Mare's* 30-yard field goal to make it 10-3. Both offences struggled in the rain and it looked like the score would remain at 10-3 until late in the 2nd quarter when Pickering punter, *Chris Kluwe* mishandled a snap and took a 9-yard loss. Cowtown took control in the red zone and scored four plays later when *Joe Flacco* found *Maurice Jones-Drew* in the end zone for a 3-yard TD to tie the game. Last year's offensive MVP, *Chris Johnson* found yards tough to come by on this day but still played a central role, carrying 8 times for 26 yards and drawing a facemask penalty on the drive that set up the eventual game-winning 28-yard field goal by *Josh Scobee*.

quarter. **Charles Woodson** picked off a screen pass and returned it 24 yards for a TD to break a 7-7 tie; then, on the Cubs' next series, safety **Yeremiah Bell** snared a tipped Bradford pass to give LA possession at the Cubs' 18 yard line. **Josh Freeman** quickly found **Roddy White** in the end zone from 5 yards out to make it 21-7. The Cubs fought back through the remainder of the contest but would never fully recover from their 1st quarter troubles. In spite of impressive running by Cubs' running back, **Arian Foster**, which included a 72-yard run from scrimmage and 180 rushing yards in total, lowa City would have trouble converting their drives into touchdowns. **Neil Rackers** connected on three straight field goals, the longest from 55 yards, to help his team scratch back within one score by the mid-point of the 3rd quarter. But the Knights added two field goals of their own to re-establish a two-score lead, 27-16, with less than 7 minutes remaining. The Cubs scrambled back within striking distance with an impressive 87-yard drive that culminated in a 1-yard TD run by Foster. With less than 3 minutes remaining, Freeman drove the Knights to the edge of **Dan Carpenter's** range and the kicker drilled a 55-yard field goal, all but sealing a big opening day win for LA.

Dez Bryant had 7 receptions for 109 yards, including a 42-yard TD.

- Eli Manning outdueled his more accomplished counterpart, going 22 of 33 for 284 yards and the game-winning TD.
- Virden wide receiver, Mike Thomas caught 9 passes for 120 yards and 6 first downs.
- York cornerback Drayton Florence intercepted Eli Manning in the 2nd quarter to set up York;s only TD.
- Tom Brady had lacklustre numbers, going 22 of 32 for 179 yards and no TDs.
- York cornerback, Chris Carr had 3 deflections and 1 interception.

GAME SUMMARY: Eli Manning found receiver Dez Bryant wide open for a 42-yard TD pass to give the home town Violators a 13-7 lead early in the 4th quarter and set the stage for an improbable opening day upset. York offensive leaders, quarterback *Tom Brady* and running back Darren McFadden, both had uncharacteristically lacklustre performances against a Virden defence that performed above expectations and did not give up a play from scrimmage over 13 yards. Brady, in particular, looked baffled by the looks of the Virden secondary and did not appear poised during two disastrous two-minute drills that could have made a difference in the outcome. After finally breaking through the Virden defence for a TD on Brandon Jacobs' 3-yard run to take a 7-3 lead late in the 2nd quarter, the Excaliburs got the ball back at their own 27 with 3 minutes left in the half. Brady moved his team to the Virden 34 yard line but failed to call a timeout before throwing incomplete as time expired. After conceding 10 points, including the Bryant TD catch, to fall behind 13-7, York capitalized on a Chris Carr interception at mid-field and a 21yard pass interference penalty to set up a 36-yard Graham Gano field goal. After Lawrence Tynes missed from 37 yards, Brady marched his team 67 yards to the Virden 24 yard line with 26 seconds remaining but failed to call timeout and threw a pass underneath as the clock expired.



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Jimmy's Week TWO picks

VIRDEN @ CHARLESWOOD (line – PATRIOTS by 8)

It's only Week Two and the Violators are already suffering key injuries. They have lost an explosive option out of the backfield in LeGarrette Blount as well as their top pass-catching tight end in Owen Daniels. A bad defensive line becomes a little more questionable with major injuries to Albert Haynesworth and Jared Odrick. All this adds up to a little bigger blowout than originally anticipated as Peyton Manning and Adrian Peterson celebrate their home opener at Patriot Place with a whipping of their cross-Provincial rivals. **PICK: CHARLESWOOD**

MOHAVE @ YORK (line -EXCALIBURS by 9)

Tom Brady didn't do the little things right against Virden in Week One and it cost the Excaliburs one of the

games they were supposed to win in pre-season projections. In the Pacific-Atlantic Conference there aren't many easy games for York but fortunately this week brings another one of them. They are also at home and get to take aim at a Mohave offence missing running back Daniel Thomas and top wide receiver Hakeem Nicks. Matt Schaub can still do something against a defence missing Alphonso Smith and Cullen Jenkins, but expect Brady to do more. **Pick: YORK**

CHINO @ IOWA CITY (line – CUBS by 3)

The Convicts' offensive line took a hit a double hit with starting left tackle Marcus McNeill and starting right guard, Robert Gallery falling to injury last week against Death Valley. That is bad news for Jay Cutler, who has trouble staying upright with the first string help. The Cubs are healthy but still face a major challenge to establish the run against the Convicts' line. If they cannot, it will put the game in Sam Bradford's hands and make for an interesting day. **Pick: CHINO**

LOS ANGELES @ DEATH VALLEY (line - UNDERTAKERS by 2)

Both teams are healthy for the Undertakers' home opener at the Graveyard, the first game to be played there since 2008. Unfortunately, their "Fantastic Four" line-backers are not in an ideal situation against a team that does not need to pass to move the ball. Jamaal Charles will find space and Josh Freeman will find holes in the secondary with the linebackers frozen in place. **Pick: LOS ANGELES**

PICKERING @ DURHAM (line – SPARTANS by 6)

The Spartans' offence did not impress against Cowtown and will need to improve this week against a Durham team facing severe scrutiny from fans and coaches alike. The good news is that Chris Johnson should find room against a mediocre defensive line recently bolstered in the pass rush with the addition of Lamarr Houston but still lacking a run-stopper. Philip Rivers once again faces a "test of leadership" – a test he is used to facing and failing. Still, it's too early for Durham to give up and I expect them to take control. **Pick: DURHAM**

MARKHAM @ COWTOWN (line - NORTH STARS by 4)

This game will say a lot about where both teams really are in the North Division pecking order. Markham comes off an upset win while Cowtown feels they deserved better against Pickering. It's a close match-up but Markham does not have a definable strength offensively which, unless the defence can score some points, will tip the balance in the home team's favour. **Pick: COWTOWN**

SCARBOROUGH @ GWINNETT (line – BLUE EAGLES by 1)

Here it is, the 'Game of the Week.' Ben Roethlisberger gets his first start as a Gladiator and the team is healthy which means the Blue Eagles will likely face their sternest test this year. The game will hinge on the play of both quarterbacks. Aaron Rodgers will be picking on the newest Gladiator, corner Dunta Robinson because the other target, Asante Samuel could make him pay. The Scarborough defence is elite, but even they can be had when not knowing what will be coming at them from play-to-play. I think the Blue Eagles will struggle to move the ball and the Glads will struggle less on their home turf. **Pick: GWINNETT**

GARLAND @ SOUTH CAROLINA (line – MUSTANGS by 2)

This is a big day for South Carolina as they open in Columbia for the first time. Unfortunately, a big part of their offence will be on the sideline for this momentous game. Tony Romo is out for a while, as is Austin Collie, which means bad news for the offence – no disrespect to journeyman Jason Campbell. The Mustangs have some offensive bite with two good running backs and Wes Welker at wide receiver. If Romo was still in the picture, I'd probably take the Regulators, but without him it's Garland's day. **Pick: GARLAND**
