CHARLESWOOD - When asked to comment on his team's Week Two performance at home against the Mohave Hellfire, Charleswood coach Jason Findlay shook his head and muttered, "I'm sorry but this game was far too frustrating to put into words." Then, with a quick and deliberate turn he left the stage and thus ended the briefest post game press conference in the short history of the EFL.

It is still too early to tell whether the Patriots are vastly overrated or merely shaking off some rust from a perfect pre-season in which few of their starters played past the first quarter in any game. It could simply be that they are just one of several very strong teams – a Titan in a league of Titans – at the moment shining brighter than the rest due to Peyton Manning's star. But what happens when Peyton's star begins to fall? Or is eclipsed by something brighter – like a blast of Hellfire?

Out of the fiery depths of Mohave came a blast intense enough to burn the hottest quarterback in the league while stunning the rest of the Patriots into a first half stupor that led to 16 points for the visitors and 0 for the home team before the midway point. It did not come immediately, but the smoking Hellfire choked the Patriot's offense in a battle of field position in the first quarter that put them narrowly in the lead, 3-0. The fiery blast itself came with the opening of the second quarter, when Mohave linebacker, Brian Urlacher dropped back into pass coverage and stepped in front of a little 2-yard hitch pass in the red zone from Manning and returned it 32 yards to his own 45 yard line. The turnover quickly led to another field goal for the visitors but,

more importantly for Mohave's short term fortunes, it seemed to rattle Peyton Manning.

On the Patriot's next possession, a botched screen led to another interception, this time by corner Al Harris in Charleswood territory. Two plays from scrimmage later Marc Bulger would find Terrell Owens open downfield for a 36-yard touchdown strike to put Mohave ahead, 13-0. The Patriot attack melted down further with a quick 3-and-out on their next possession and four minutes later Mohave kicker, John Carney split the uprights from 32 yards away to increase the visitor's lead to 16-0, a lead they would hold going into half time.

The Patriots finally caught a break, and with it some life, early in the second half, when linebacker, Adellius Thomas, hiding unseen deep along the sideline, snared a Marc Bulger pass as it arced over his head toward Terrell Owens, giving his team good field position at their own 40 yard line. Manning wasted no time exploiting the opportunity, finding Chad Johnson open 32 yards downfield to knife into Mohave territory. Then the running game took over as Adrian Peterson and Thomas Jones combined for 33 yards to finish off the drive with a 3-yard lunge into the endzone by Jones. The Patriots were back in the game and the Mohave flame was flickering.

The momentum continued to shift back towards the Patriots when rookie Hellfire running back, Marshawn Lynch, fumbled in his own territory after taking a thundering hit from Adellius Thomas. With the ball at Mohave's 31, the Patriots again went to the ground, grinding out 28 yards before Manning, facing an all-out blitz by the entire Mohave defense, somehow found Thomas Jones open beyond the "firewall" of blitzers for another touchdown.

With their hard won 16-point lead suddenly sheared down to 2 points, it was the visitor's turn to come unglued. On their next series, an uncharacteristic breakdown in pass protection by the Hellfire front five led to a big 3rd down sack by Bart Scott and the loss of good field position. The Patriots took over at their own 15 yard line and marched impressively up the field, reaching the Mohave 30 yard line before finally being stopped. Stephen Gostkowski kicked it true from 47 yards away and the Patriots, with 11:14 left in the final quarter, had their first (albeit narrow) lead of the game, 17-16.

But the Hellfire had enough powder for one more fiery blast. In a gamble worthy of a Vegas high-roller, Coach Bobby Elder elected to go for it on 4th down and 1 at his own 35 yard line! The Patriots, in an almost equally huge gamble, went into a goal line defense, sending everyone but the corners into the box to stuff the run. As the ball was snapped, tight end L.J. Smith slipped past his blocking assignment and dashed toward the sideline. Two seconds later he was stepping under a beautiful touch pass from Bulger, bringing it in and racing 65 yards to pay dirt in a foot race that wasn't even close. The Hellfire gamble had paid off and the Patriot's gamble had turned up snake eyes.

Mohave's two-point conversion attempt failed, reducing the scoring damage to 6, but the damage to the Patriot's morale was palpable. Although behind by only 5 points with over 8 minutes remaining, they appeared flat and missed their golden opportunity to regain the lead after Hellfire punter, Sam Koch, fumbled the 4th down snap at his own 5 yard line. Instead of plunging the dagger in, the Patriots made three feeble thrusts that were easily turned away by a fired-up Hellfire 'D.' A Gostkowski field goal narrowed the Mohave lead to 22-20, but that would be all for the scoring on this day. The Patriot's hope ended when a botched two-minute drill resulted in 4 straight incompletions by Manning, balls that weren't even close to their targets. A muted chorus of boos from the disappointed fans could be heard as Mohave's back-up quarterback, Matt Schaub, came on the field to kneel away the remaining 22 seconds and seal the win.

BY THE NUMBERS: Manning was ineffective, completing only 15 of 39 passes for 170 yards and 1 TD. He threw 2 picks, fumbled twice, and was sacked 3 times. His QB rating was 39.5. Mohave's Brian Westbrook put up 148 all-purpose yards (80 rush/68 pass) to grab MVP honours. Terrell Owens caught 5 passes for 109 yards and 1 TD.

Much to the delight of the Glads fans, the coach Birdsall was wrong as Gwinnett cruised to an easy 33-3 home victory.

The opposing coaches had different approaches as the Swamp Dogs went to the air almost exclusively while the Glads stayed on the ground to stay away from that all-world secondary. It looked like both strategies were going to work as the teams each scored field goals on their opening drives. The Dogs would then stop Gwinnett on their next drive. However, that would be the last time they would force Gwinnett to punt until the game was out of hand and the Swamp Dogs could only manage a missed field goal to start the second half and never really got close until late in the game when only TD's would matter.

Injuries bit the Swamp Dogs as they left the Coliseum a bit beat up with Gary Brackett and Tony Ugo expected to miss one game apiece and Stephen Neal expected to miss two games. The Glads lost Darrell Jackson for two games due to a bum hammy. The Game MVP was Willie Parker with his 158 of Gwinnett's total 262 rushing yards. GUNFIGHT ON DRAGONMOUNT

FLORIDA - There is a new Gunslinger in town and he calls himself ROMO. Dragon fans were more than just a little concerned after their team was man handled in the season opener and then having to face the hot handed Kutztown quarterback ROMO. Kutztown had just finished humiliating Meadowlands by putting 63 points on the scoreboard and were poised to take advantage of a weak Dragon defense.

The Dragons won the opening coin toss and immediately took control of the line of scrimmage while marching down the field on the power running of Steven Jackson. After putting up 7 points on a Brady TD pass to fullback, Mike Karney, ROMO and the Golden Bears responded with a drive of their own, covering 68 yards in 13 plays, mostly on the legs of Larry Johnson, and finishing with the Kutztown running back bowling across the goal line from 1 yard out to tie the game.

Florida came right back with another TD drive, keyed by a 32-yard pass from Brady to T.J. Houshmandzadeh to start it off, and ending with a 14-yard pass to Mark Clayton for the big score. Dragon's kicker, Mike Nugent added a 45-yard field goal at the end of the 2nd quarter to give the home team a 17-7 half time lead.

Little did either team know at the time, but the grinding start to this contest would not be an indicator of second half play. The end game would turn mostly on Big Plays by both sides, and ROMO would be the beneficiary of the first big play. A Darren Sharper interception of Tom Brady gave ROMO the ball on the Florida 28 yard line. 3 plays later he connected with tight end, Desmond Clark who fell forward across the goal line to pull the Bears to within 3.

The next big play was a decision by Coach Katsafanas to go for it on 4th down and 2 to go on his own 42 yard line on the first play of the 4th quarter. A short hitch to Harrison into double coverage was batted down and Florida went immediately on the attack. 5 plays later, Clayton caught his second TD pass of the game from 3 yards away and Florida's 10-point cushion was restored. Nugent would add another field goal to capitalize on a Clark Haggans interception and the home team was ahead 27-14.

The Golden Bears did not fold. On their next possession, ROMO moved his team quickly to a 1st and goal from the Dragons 6 yard line on the strength of a 53-yard pass play to Marvin Harrison. However, the Dragon's dug their claws in and ultimately held ROMO and company on a 3rd down and 3 to go. However, the Zebras orchestrated the next Big Play, penalizing the Dragon defenders. On the replay, Kutztown was able to put up 6 and tack on the extra point with 2:37 remaining. But a failed onside kick all but sealed the game for Florida, as they marched down the field to set up Mike Nugent's 3rd field goal of the game and a two-score lead, 30-21, that would hold up to the end.

BY THE NUMBERS: Tony Romo was far from the budding superstar he was in Week One, finishing 9 of 21 for 157 yards, 2 TDs and 2 INTs for a QB rating of 61.1. Tom Brady, meanwhile, improved on a shaky performance last week against Mohave by completing 20 of 29 passes for 228 yards and 3 TDs. 2 picks were the only blemish on the day.

The Fumble Fest started early, after the Cowtown defense

stonewalled the Cubbies on their first possession. A wind-assisted 70 yard punt by Ryan Plackemeier wobbled and dipped like a knuckleball, throwing returner, Mewelde Moore off balance and causing a critical muff that was recovered by Donte Whitner at Cowtown's 11 yard line. One play was all it took, an 11-yard TD pass from Jeff Garcia to Roy Williams, to put the visitors ahead and to set the tone for a star-crossed day for Cowtown.

Iowa City made some big plays of their own to put the pressure on the hosts. A 59-yard kickoff return by Dante Hall, followed by a 29-yard straight route to Lee Evans set up Iowa City's second TD, another Garcia-to-Williams pass play on a hitch from 12 yards out. The Corn Kings responded with their finest moment of the day, a 60-yard touchdown drive that ended with a one-yard plunge by Marion Barber to narrow the Cubs lead to 14-10.

The rest of the game was an unmitigated disaster for Cowtown, and especially for their quarterback, Chad Pennington. The Corn King quarterback was picked off 4 times, twice in the red zone, setting up 20 points for his opponents. Mewelde Moore went on to fumble 3 punt returns leading to a further 10 points. In all, 30 of 37 Iowa City points came off of Corn King turnovers. The lone Corn King takeaway led directly to a TD by rookie linebacker, Paul Posluszny, on a 29-yard fumble recovery, but it was too little too late.

The underdog Iowa City Cubs, showed how dangerous they could be through the air, as veteran Jeff Garcia

completed 15 of 19 passes for 195 yards and 3 touchdowns. The two-pronged running attack of Ronnie Brown and Reggie Bush was just enough to keep the Corn Kings' defense honest.

Meanwhile, the Corn Kings ground up some turf themselves, as "Cerebrus" (as fans have dubbed the 3-RB attack of Maroney, Barber and Norwood) rushed for 171 yards on 25 carries. But "Cerebrus" could not make up for a horrible day by Chad Pennington, whose game day QB rating of 30.1 was the worst of all starting QBs this week. He repeatedly got his team into a position to score, but would throw a pick, or miss a target, at critical times.

Coach Redding expressed his surprise immediately after the game. "We never game planned for this, but it was the kind of surprise we like."

mediocre performances last week against Los Angeles, to post All-Pro numbers in Week Two against Durham. McNabb posted a “perfect” QB rating of 158.3, completing 24 of 30 passes for 381 yards and 4 TD passes without an interception. His ground game counterpart, LT, broke out with 124 yards rushing on 24 carries and 69 receiving yards on 7 receptions for 193 all-purpose yards and 2 TDs – one through the air and one on the ground.

Criticism leveled at Tomlinson and his offensive line last week, turned to praise in the flush of victory as talk show hosts in Chino started talking Championship after the underdog Convicts pushed around the Durham defense, and their defense contained the Durham offense after some early troubles.

The Thunder Lizards easily converted their first two possessions into touchdowns, and it looked as if a big day was in the offing for Philip Rivers and Frank Gore. But the Durham offense would never find the end zone again after the 8:24 mark of the first quarter, as Rivers suddenly appeared confused by Chino’s mixed coverage packages. The Thunder Lizards pivot finished with only 10 completions in 21 attempts before giving way to back-up Brady Quinn after the game got out of hand.

Frank Gore ripped off a 56-yard run to boost his game rushing total to 116 yards on 12 carries, but he did not turn out to be the factor he could have been in a closer contest. The Durham defense could not solve the Convicts’ attack, looking at times panicked and confused. Anquan Boldin took advantage, getting routinely open and finishing with 157 yards and 1 TD on 7 receptions.

ANCHORAGE – Leonard Little had a career day, recording 3 sacks, 2 run stuffs, and 2 forced fumbles to spark the Buccaneers past the visiting LA Knights. Drew Brees looked in fine form, passing for 272 yards and 2 TDs, and Joseph Addai rushed for 134 yards and tallied another 60 through the air to lead the offense.

The Knights managed to move the ball, but miscues and 6 sacks were their undoing. David Carr battled poor pass protection all day and did not complete a pass over 15 yards.
