DRAGONS BREATHE FIRE IN 4TH QUARTER – ESCAPE GWINNETT WITH WIN

Florida controls the ball for over 14 minutes in final frame – Brady throws winning TD with 33 seconds left



GWINNETT – The Gwinnett Gladiators fought hard but not hard enough as the visiting Dragons won a nail-biter at the Coliseum, 28-22. Down 15-14 after 3 quarters, Florida dominated the fourth quarter by holding the ball for two time-consuming touchdown drives of 18 plays and 15 plays each. Gwinnett had the ball for a total of 45 seconds in the final period, but made the most of it with a Leon Washington 99-yard kickoff return in between the two Florida drives to take a 22-21 lead with a little over 6 minutes remaining. That set the stage for the winning drive, a 15-play, 80 yard monster that ended with a 13-yard TD pass from Tom Brady to T.J. Houshmandzadeh with 33 seconds left on the clock.

The Gwinnett defense did a fine job of containing Tom Brady and the Florida offense for the first three quarters, allowing just one touchdown by the offense prior to the fateful fourth. The Glad's offense scored four times in their first five drives, but were limited to field goals as the Dragon's defense stiffened every time, three times inside the 10 yard line. Yamon Figurs' 97-yard kickoff return for a touchdown put the Dragons ahead at half time, 14-12.

The Dragons turned to the running game to grind down the Gwinnett defense late in the game. With Gibril Wilson out of the game due to injury, and the players showing signs of fatigue, the Dragons ploughed forward unspectacularly but relentlessly, riding the legs of running back, DeAngelo Williams more than the arm of Tom Brady. Williams finished the day with 142 yards on 25 carries and 1 TD. Brady did not display MVP form until late, completing less than 50% of his passes for just 135 yards, but completing two in the end zone to complete the comeback.

ALLISON'S KICK RETURN TD SPARKS HELLFIRE

GAME POINTS: Mohave's **Aundrae Allison** fumbled to set up a Ringgold touchdown, but then returned the ensuing kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown and a 27-23 lead late in the third quarter. Clinging to a one-point lead with two minutes remaining in the game, the Hellfire defense stoned Ringgold running back, **Tim Hightower** for no gain on 4th down and short at the Mohave 30 yard line. **KEY PERFORMANCES:** Mohave's **Brian Westbrook** scored 3 touchdowns – 2 through the air and 1 on the ground. SHARKS IN THE TANK

It took one week for the EFL's "Australian Experiment" to fail – former Sharks owner, Australian Adventure Tours magnate, *Chris Mordas*, reportedly went off on an "extreme" adventure to Pitcairn Island without leaving anyone in charge of the team. The players showed up at **Death Valley** with trainers and equipment but no coaches. Apparently no coaches were ever hired, leaving the players to practice on their own during training camp – providing a possible explanation why *Matt Cassell* was listed as the starting quarterback in the Brisbane Bay Media Guide. *Matt Hasselbeck* ran the offence and *Mike Vrabel* ran the defense in their Week One loss to the Undertakers. The league revoked the **Brisbane Bay** franchise after the game, citing owner negligence and other unspecified irregularities as contributing to the decision.

A STAR RISES IN THE NORTH

It did not take long for the League to find a new owner for the former Brisbane Bay franchise. Pomegranate Computers tycoon, *Darrin Jones*, snatched up the league's orphaned team and renamed it the **Markham North Stars**. They will play their games in Cleveland until a proper EFL stadium can be built in Markham. In an interview given to the 'Markham Economist & Sun,' Jones revealed that he had already met with the veteran players on his team and affirmed his commitment to building "a winning organization."

A rash of injures hit EFL teams in Week One, leading one to wonder about the "pansiness" level in training camp and pre-season games. Eight players expected to be out in Week Two were listed by their teams as "shaken." "Shaken??" What the hell does that mean? To me, "shaken" is what an old lady feels when her car gets bumped in a minor fender bender at the supermarket. Hardest hit by injuries were **Winnemucca** and **Cowtown**, both losing four starters. The Outlaws lost safety, *Mike Brown* and tackle, *Jon Jansen* for extended periods. Brown is apparently so "shaken" that he has been sent away for a psychiatric assessment. Jansen's knee is apparently now facing the wrong way, requiring surgery. The Corn Kings will be without the services of their top two wide receivers, *D.J. Hackett* and *Santana Moss*, as well as running backs, *Laurence Maroney* and *Shaun Alexander* for their game against Florida this week. I'm already penciling them in as 0-2 on my Week 2 projection sheet.

NEW YORK GRIPES

The **Buccaneers** set a high bar for ineptitude by turning the ball over seven times in their Week One blowout loss to **Los Angeles**. It could have been worse – they had 8 fumbles. **Colorado** managed to score just 3 points at home against a banged up **Winnemucca** defense; *Matt Ryan* looked like much like the rookie he is, but on the positive side did not turn the ball over. **Kutztown** beat **Cowtown**, despite gaining a league low 45 yards rushing; the **Golden Bears** averaged 1.8 yards a carry on the day. *Chad Pennington's* days in **Cowtown** may be numbered. The **Cub's** *Nine Million Dollar Man* notched 10 tackles against the **Convicts** at \$56,250 a tackle.

JIMMY'S WEEK TWO PICKS

GWINNETT @ CHARLESWOOD (LINE - PATRIOTS BY 3)

The Patriots are without their best interior defensive lineman, Richard Seymour, who appears to be out for several weeks with a cracked elbow. The Pats lack depth at the interior line and at linebacker, so how they compensate for this loss will be interesting. They are also missing center, Brad Meester, who will be replaced by veteran Jeremy Newberry. The Glad's losses are not as severe and that is a good thing for Gwinnett because they will be challenged trying to stop the running tandem of Adrian Peterson and Jerious Norwood while also keeping tabs on Wes Welker, 'Ocho Cinco' and Tony Gonzalez in the secondary. The Patriots retain their offensive weapons but cannot take their opponent lightly – the Gladiators all but shut down Tom Brady for most of the game last week and can do the same with Peyton Manning. Carson Palmer will rely on Willie Parker to lure the Patriot's linebackers close to the line and open up room for his receivers underneath. He needs a good game from "Fast" Willie to have success against the league's best secondary. Gwinnett has the horses to outrun Charleswood on their home turf and I think they will.

DURHAM @ MOHAVE (LINE -HELLFIRE BY 2)

The Thunder Lizard's offense does not match up well against the Mohave defense. Champ Bailey and Al Harris can handle Ronald Curry and Calvin Johnson and Kelvin Hayden can more than take care of the slot. Antonio Gates will get a lot of attention, both from the Hellfire and from Philip Rivers. The Durham running game, spearheaded by one of the better offensive lines in the league, will not easily move Jamal Williams off the line with the line-backing corps in close support. Unfortunately for Mohave, their offense is in a similar position – they will struggle to win the battle at the line of scrimmage against a solid Durham front four. The Hellfire have two things going for them: home field advantage and two great individual players in Brian Westbrook and Terrell Owens. Look for that to make to difference.

COWTOWN @ FLORIDA (LINE -DRAGONS BY 8)

The Corn Kings would have had their hands full with Florida at Dragonmount on a good day, but with four main players on offense injured, including their top two wide receivers, they will need a miracle to prevail this week. It will be an impressive showing if they can finish inside the 8-point spread. The Dragons had all they could handle in Gwinnett last week but ended up making the plays when they needed to and pulling out the victory. Look for Brady and Company to make all the plays they need and more, and for the Dragon's "Firewall" to stop the Corn Kings cold.

PICK: FLORIDA

RINGGOLD @ KUTZTOWN (LINE -GOLDEN BEARS BY 6)

The Crimson Hawks are banged up and missing their most dynamic offensive weapon, Maurice Jones-Drew. The Golden Bears are completely healthy and at home. Kutztown had trouble getting their running game on track last week against Cowtown and will have trouble doing it again against a dangerous and aggressive Ringgold defense. If they cannot run, Romo will face lots of pressure (hell, he may face it anyway) in the passing game and will have to make quick decisions. "Big Ben" is a solid leader but operates behind a fly curtain offensive line. This will be a close game, but the Golden Bears will pull away in the final quarter. **PICK: KUTZTOWN**

IOWA CITY @ MARKHAM (LINE - CUBS BY 8)

The Cubs made a statement last week winning convincingly over the Champion Convicts. This week they head to Cleveland, fully healthy, to face the expansion Markham North Stars in that team's first ever "home" game. The North Stars are missing their top running back, Jamal Lewis and their top receiver, Deion Branch; not that it matters much against a team like the Cubs. Iowa City may be the class of the Pacific-Atlantic Conference and has nothing to fear from an orphaned expansion club. *PICK: IOWA CITY*

DEATH VALLEY @ LOS ANGELES (LINE - KNIGHTS BY 6)

As good as the Knights defense is nobody expected them to devastate the Anchorage offense and Drew Brees like they did in Week One. If they can do it against a team like Anchorage, it is natural to assume they can do it against an expansion team like Death Valley. But the Undertakers have a seasoned quarterback who specializes in improvising on the fly and can make plays that aren't supposed to be there. In spite of an injury to Mike Jenkins, Death Valley should score enough points to win. Which means the Knights will have to score some points of their own with Tavaris Jackson going up against a surprisingly stout Death Valley defense. Jermaine Phillips is out, but Madieu Williams is not much of a drop off. Almost needless to say, Los Angeles will have to run the ball with success to open up the passing game for Jackson. They have a good offensive line and they are at home. *PICK: LOS ANGELES*

WINNEMUCCA @ CHINO (LINE - CONVICTS BY 5)

The Outlaws struggled to score against Colorado and are lucky to have emerged from the Thunderdome with a win. They are banged up and outgunned going against an angry Convicts team that is licking its wounds after dropping a tough game to their bitter rival, Iowa City. Jay Cutler has something to prove to his team, his fans, and himself. Look for him to air it out against a mediocre secondary and put big points on the board. **PICK: CHINO**

ANCHORAGE @ COLORADO (LINE -BUCCANEERS BY 7)

This game is an opportunity for the Buccaneers to get the bad taste of last week's loss to the Knights out of their mouths. The Thundersnow have some good young players, but they are clearly overmatched at this level as last week's loss to underwhelming Winnemucca showed. This should be a rout for Anchorage and a big day for Drew Brees, but *you never know*. The Buccaneers specialize in losing to teams they should beat, and winning when nobody expects them to. That makes it difficult for people like me, who pride themselves on knowing what's going on, to make rational picks from week to week. Never mind, it would take a nut to pick Colorado to cover. I may be crazy, but I'm not nuts. **PICK: ANCHORAGE**
