

KNIGHTS CHARGE TO VICTORY OVER GLADIATORS!

Los Angeles quarterback, David Carr, drops back to pass in Week Eight action against Gwinnett. Carr picked apart the Gladiator's defense, completing over 80% of his passes and throwing 2 touchdowns while getting sacked only once in a 31-16 victory. Carr said after the game, "I'm not going to lie to you. I like proving you media types wrong." LOS ANGELES – For the second straight week the LA Knights did exactly what they had to do to win, but more impressively this time against a top contender in the East, the Gwinnett Gladiators.

Starting at the top with David Carr and finishing with an all-pro defensive performance by the virtually unknown rookie defensive end, Tamba Hali, the Knights executed brilliantly in all phases of the game and came out on top in a game they controlled from the outset.

Carr, the subject of back-biting criticism from the media early in the season, took a big step forward in gaining fan support and justifying his coach's faith with a strong showing through the air. Carr completed 83% of his passes in throwing for 226 yards and 2 touchdowns on the day.

His 122 passer rating was a season best and he was the hands down choice for MVP, despite getting a lot of support from Todd Heap, who caught 3 touchdown passes, (including one from Tarvaris Jackson on his first pass of the year), and wide receivers, Steve Smith and Arnaz Battle. Battle stepped up impressively, snagging 7 balls after starting split end, Terry Glenn, left early with what the team is reporting to be a twisted ankle.

However, the biggest assist goes to the entire LA defense, which gave Carson Palmer and the normally efficient Gladiator offense no room to maneuver and punished them severely at the first signs of life. The Knights actually forced 6 fumbles (although 2 were overturned after penalties), intercepted Palmer 3 times, and sacked him 5 times. When Palmer wasn't getting sacked, he was being endlessly harassed in the pocket and finished with a game day QB rating of 54.8, his worst of the season. Willie Parker also posted his lowest numbers of the year, rushing for only 52 yards at 3.1 yards a carry, while top receiver Reggie Wayne was held to only 2 catches while making 3 drops.

The Knights got off to a strong start, scoring majors on each of their first two possessions – a 10-yard run by Tatum Bell; and a 6-yard pass from Carr to Heap after an Alex Brown interception set them up at midfield – and they would never look back. The Gladiators were kept out of the end zone until the dying minutes of the final quarter, scoring a cosmetic touchdown on a 31-yard highlight reel pass to Braylon Edwards as Palmer, for once that day, stood tall in the teeth of another aggressive Knights blitz to get the pass off.

Tamba Hali, the rookie, led all defenders with 10 tackles, 2 sacks, 2 stuffs, 1 forced fumble and an interception. His third down sack of Carson Palmer on 3^{rd} down and goal-to-go from the 5 ended a Gladiator TD threat in the third quarter and his interception three possessions later set up the final LA touchdown and signaled the end of Gwinnett's comeback hopes.

The Gladiators lost the heart and soul of their defense, Troy Polamalu before the end of the first half, a loss that certainly affected their defensive game plan. They also lost rookie linebacker, Jon Beason when he tried to level Todd Heap but hit his own player instead and fell awkwardly to the turf. Early reports have Polamalu listed as doubtful for next week's game against Iowa City, while Beason is listed as out.

Larry Johnson, "Earth," rushed for 118 yards and scored a touchdown while the "Wind," clocked at as high as 20 miles per hour at Lincoln financial Field, knocked a few Donovan McNabb passes off their course. Tony Romo, "Fire," fired another 2 TD passes to give him 19 on the year.

"Water" did not enter into the game until late in the fourth quarter in the form of an early shower for McNabb, who struggled all day and posted a miserable 31.4 QB rating.

The Golden Bear defense came up with some big plays, including a 50yard interception return by Lito Sheppard that set up Kutztown's first TD on a 10-yard pass from Romo to Marvin Harrison.

COWTOWN – As many had predicted, the team with the ball last won the game on a field goal. And, as many had predicted, that team did indeed turn out to be Charleswood. With the score tied 10-10, the Patriots controlled the ball for almost 12 minutes in the fourth quarter, finally getting close enough for an easy 27-yard field goal by Stephen Gostkoswki with 39 seconds remaining.

The Cowtown defense did a fine job of bending, but not breaking against the Manning-led Patriots, getting the job done at key moments to end scoring drives. But in the end the veteran took what the Corn Kings gave him, and ground

out the victory with short passes and runs.

Meanwhile, the Patriot's defense smothered the Pennington-led Corn Kings, leaving them little room for maneuver. Apart from an impressive opening drive of 80 yards, which led to Cowtown's only major score, and a great individual effort from Santana Moss on a 68-yard catch-and-run play that set up their only field goal, the Corn King offensive "machine" hardly moved at all. After Chris Hope's end zone interception of Pennington in the 2nd quarter, the Corn Kings offense fizzled and the Pats defense feasted, stopping the run and shutting down the pass. How bad? Cowtown did not make a first down in the entire second half!

and plenty of scoring. But heading in to the Week 8 contest between the struggling Anchorage Buccaneers and the solid Florida Dragons, many had written off the Bucs as any kind of a threat to challenge the emerging hierarchy of EFL teams, in which the Dragons were one that occupied a respectably high ranking. The Buc's defense had been embarrassingly bad while the offense, their supposed strength, had been inconsistent to say the least. The Dragons had played well on both sides of the ball, and it looked like it would be an easy win for the home team.

But, as they say, "this is why they play the games." The Buccaneer's top draft pick, Drew Brees, finally showed why he was selected number two overall, by taking control and simply out-scoring the Dragons by attacking their one weakness, the secondary. He did this in spite of his own defense, which, true to established form, played poorly – in fact, worse than usual, except for a game-saving stop on a controversial 2-point conversion attempt by Florida with one minute remaining in the game – but more on that later.

The game started for the Dragons as many have this season, as they watched the opposing team drive the field to score first. However, they answered with 7 points of their own on the back Tom Brady, and the race was on! The first half of the game was like watching the game in fast forward. Each team would move up and down the field at will, with the Dragons surviving with a 24 to 17 lead at half time.

Unfortunately, for Dragon fans, the home team could not survive their first 3 possessions in the 3rd quarter. Threatening in Buccaneer's territory and with the Buc's defense keying on Jackson, Brady thought he had a clear passing lane to the tight end, only to have Bly step out from behind an official and make the pick. Anchorage would take advantage of their good fortune to add 7 to tie the game.

A Yamon Figurs kick return of 65 yards put Florida in position to regain the lead, but a key penalty by starting guard Manuwai turned a 3rd and 4 from the 20 into a 3rd and 14 from the 30. Then, a brutal sack by Corey Williams resulted in a fumble, which was unsuccessfully challenged, (since Brady's arm was obviously throwing the ball as he was hit). The fans came close to riot when it was discovered that two of the instant replay cameras, instead of focusing on the game, were in fact filming two Anchorage women who were unexplainably removing their tank tops. The women had to be escorted from the stands for their own protection.

On the very next play, Florida would be abused by the zebras for the 3rd consecutive play in a row. Richard Marshall was called for pass interference on a play where he looked to have position on Johnson to tack on 27 yards for Anchorage to set up the go-ahead field goal. With 6 minutes to play, the Dragons would get the ball one more time in the 3rd quarter. The drive started in promising fashion with a 16-yard gain by Housh, but two more 5-yard penalties would continue to erode away the gains. Things looked better when Brady caught Anchorage in an all out run defense, but, as it turned out, to no avail. He was mauled and sacked again as the offensive line, clearly gun-shy after so many penalties, played it soft and let Leonard Little through virtually untouched.

Anchorage would take over and Brees would play the hero, as he would find Johnson deep on a 3^{rd} and 10. A few plays later, Alge Crumpler would play catch and run for a 32 yard score and a 34-24 lead. After another failed series, Florida would get their opportunity as they recovered a McGahee fumble. Five plays later, Florida would put up 7 and close to within 3 again, and trail 34-31. However, it would take Anchorage only one big play to answer – a 64-yard TD pass from Brees to Marques Colston to put the visitors up 41-31.

The Dragons fought back, notching a field goal and then recovering an onside kick with 2:26 left in the game. 9 plays and 60 yards later, they were in the end zone on a 13-yard pass from Brady to Jerricho Cotchery to pull within 1 point and set up the controversial 2-point conversion attempt.

It is the kind of gamble that makes a coach look ballsy when it works, or could possibly cost him his job if it doesn't; an all-or-nothing gambit that takes the coin flip out of the equation; a match of Offense versus Defense in a "winner takes all" show down. It was clear that Jim Heaton, for good reason, was ready to bet that his offense could move the ball 2 yards against the worst defense in the EFL. But for once, miraculously, the Bucs held, and for their efforts a hard fought and improbable victory was preserved and maybe....just maybe....their season was rescued.

The offensive highlights in this game were numerous. Both teams combined for 1,161 yards and 63 first downs! Both quarterbacks had 400 yard passing games – Brees hitting 27 of 35 for 432 yards, 3 TDs and no interceptions; Brady completing 32 of 43 for 427 yards, 3 TDs and 1 interception. Florida's Steven Jackson, despite being keyed dozens of times, still managed to rush for 154 yards and 2 TDs on 35 carries, while Anchorage running backs, led by Joseph Addai and Willis McGahee, combined to rush for 186 yards and 2 TDs on 32 carries. 4 wide receivers, two on each team, recorded 100+ yards receiving.

As impressive as the offensive fireworks were, it was also a sloppy game, especially for Florida. The Dragons were hit with close to 100 yards in penalties and struggled to convert on third down, while their defense looked lost and out of position. After the game, Florida coach, Jim Heaton, clearly feeling the glow of six-pack (or more) of Bud, told the media, "I take responsibility. That's right, I do take responsibility! I take responsibility for not hitting that goddamn official in the head and taking him out when I had the chance." (A league fine is expected to follow).

MEADOWLANDS – It was a predictable result but with some strange stat twists thrown in for variety: Philip Rivers struggled, throwing 2 TD passes but also getting picked twice and completing only 8 passes for a QB rating of 50. The Durham running tandem of Frank "Dino-Gore" and Clinton "Portis-Saurus" rushed for 196 and 112 yards respectively carrying the ball a whopping 52 times. Javon Walker led the Swampies' running "attack" with 62 yards rushing on 1 carry.

Earlier than predicted, T-Lizards backups were in the game in the second quarter with the score 28-0, Durham. A 2-TD push back by Meadowlands brought the first stringers back in the second half for a cameo appearance to stabilize the situation. Then the Durham offensive line took over and they held on to the ball the rest of the way.

CUBS STUN MOHAVE AT THE FIERY DEPTHS!

GIANT KILLERS STAY IN RACE WITH ANOTHER IMPROBABLE UPSET / JACOBS RUNS FOR 159 YARDS



MOHAVE – The seeds of an upset were sewn on Mohave's first play from scrimmage – a bomb to the post from Marc Bulger to Terrell Owens that went a little too far for the temperamental wide-out but right into the hands of Cub corner, DeAngelo Hall. He took the ball and dodged and darted his way 70 yards on the return to go the distance and give the heavy underdogs an early 7-0 lead.


Mohave recovered with a virtuosic 16-play drive that began on their own 2 yard line and went the distance, ending on a 7-yard pass from Bulger to Laveranues Coles to tie the game. But then something happened that was more

unexpected than the Hall interception return: the Cubs came right back with a sustained drive of their own, highlighted by a 38-yard pass to Lee Evans, to regain the lead, 14-7. A Mike Vrabel interception in the second quarter set up another TD, a 24-yard pass from Garcia to Kellen Winslow, to silence the shocked crowd at the Fiery Depths.

The Hellfire pulled to within 4 to start the second half when Bulger found Coles in the end zone after an 80-yard drive to make the score 21-17 Iowa. With the home crowd regaining bravado, a team with more respect for the odds-makers may have self-destructed at this point and given Mohave their rightful victory. But not the Cubs – they specialize in humbling the proud.

The Cubs unleashed Brandon Jacobs, who gained 45 of 65 yards on the gamewinning TD drive, that ended on an 8yard pass from Garcia to Roy Williams that put the Baby Bears ahead for good and finished off what may be the biggest upset of the year in the league thus far.
