

	21	St.Charles opens up a commanding 24-7 lead heading into the 4 th quarter and coasts to a 24-21 win. Neither team could do much on the ground but both quarterbacks had solid outings, Wentz going 26 of 32 for 283 yards and three TDs while Luck was almost as good with a 21 of 34 for 212 yards and three TD stat line.

	41	In a penalty filled game Marcus Mariota took matters into his own hands completing 22 of 28 passes for 227 yards and 4 TDs and tacking on another 60 yards on the ground on 5 carries to lead the Bombers to victory. A Jared Goff pick deep in New Jersey territory by Kyle Fuller late in the third quarter resulted in a quick Bruxelles score, sealing the game.

	3	In a game between the two long time rivals Virden spots Charleswood an early 3-0 then hammers the visitors for 40. Virden's offense was paced by Patrick Mahomes who completed 19 of 24 passes for 196 yards and 3 TDs and Ezekiel Elliott who grounded out 175 yards on 25 carries. The Violators' defense was equally impressive allowing 128 total yards and only 7 first downs on the day.

	34	Peg City won the statistical battle against heavily favoured Twin Cities, including an unbalanced 38:39 to 21:21 time of possession, but lost the war. Mitch Trubisky was a pedestrian 15 of 26 but he hit numerous downfield targets amassing 260 yards and 2 TDs. Trailing by 7 in the 3 rd Peg City's Beau Brinkley snapped the ball over punter Matt Haack's head leading to a quick FG. Game over.

	10	Coming off a training camp that had pundits questioning the Knights' discipline Los Angeles proved them right by getting flagged an incredible 13 times for 125 yards. It was constantly one step forward two steps back for LA. For Chino, Dak Prescott hit on 18 of 23 passes for a modest 220 yards and 1 TD while Christian McCaffrey toted the rock 18 times for 60 yards and a TD.

	17	Russell Wilson hit on 15 of 24 tosses for 258 and 2 TDs, both to Tyler Lockett, while James Connor secured 87 ground yards on 20 carries. Eli Manning, holding off Sam Darnold for the starting assignment, was mildly effective for Seattle as he only completed 50% of his passes for 238 yards and a TD. Kareem Hunt eclipsed 100 yards with 106 on the day.

	17	Coming off a dismal 2-14 season the Scarborough Blue Eagles travelled to Sebastian and were thoroughly trounced by the home side which jumped out to a 21-0 lead and coasted home. Drew Brees completed 28 of 36 passes for 357 yards and 3 TDs, including 2 TDs to Odell Beckham Jr, for the Swordfish while Brock Osweiler connected on 22 of 36 for 248 yards and 2 TDs for the Blue Eagles.

	39	Durham opened the 2019 season exactly the way they closed the 2018 season, held scoreless in the first half and hopelessly behind the Corn Kings. Joe Flacco got the opening day assignment but it was the Todd Gurley show as he chewed up the Lizards to the tune of 214 yards on 30 carries (3 TDs) and tacked on another 57 on a single reception. The final score flattered outmanned Durham.

	7	A half time score of 31-0 for Pickering says all that needs to be said. The Spartans dominated every aspect of the game, more than doubling the Excaliburs in offense. Philip Rivers went 14 of 19 for 185 yards and 3 TDs while Miles Sanders and Doug Martin each gained 84 yards on the ground. Tom Brady had a poor outing as he completed less than 50% of his 32 passes for a mere 124 yards.

	14	Baker Mayfield opened the season in fine form for Budapest as he went 21-26 for 274 yards and 2 TDs, with Stefon Diggs hauled in all 8 of his targets for 120 yards and a TD. David Johnson, coming off an injury plagued season, rushed 13 times for 52 yards and 2 TDs. DeAndre Hopkins starred for Brooklin as he caught 10 passes for 110 yards and a TD.

	21	Aaron Rodgers in his first game as a Wolverine disappoints, going 15 of 31 for 189 yards. Matt Ryan, on the other hand, does what Matt Ryan does as he completes 26 of 39 passes for 360 yards and 3 TDs with Devante Adams on the receiving end of 15 tosses for 234 yards and a score. Kenyan Drake also hauled in 2 TD passes for Aurora while Saquon Barkley found paydirt twice for Toronto.

	14	Looking to put a dismal 2018 season to rest the Cadillac hosted Georgia to open the 2019 season, dominating the time of possession. Unfortunately an anemic red zone offense limited them to a single FG on four attempts and with Big Ben tossing a late TD pass to Will Fuller fell to the Gladiators 14-9 in a game that looked eerily similar to many in 2018.

NEW JERSEY @ BUFFALO (line – DERAILERS by 8)

INJURIES: New Jersey – None; Buffalo – Rashaan Evans (OUT).

The Derailers were slow starters in their season-opener against the Chargers, but roared back and were a lost red zone fumble away from a chance to at least force overtime. They get full marks for spirit, but remedial measures are required for a highly-touted defence that did not make a stop until the 4th quarter. The Wrecking Balls fell in a shootout against the Bombers last week. The offence performed above expectations against a tough Bruxelles defence, but the defence looked ragged. Both these teams need to log a '1' in the 'W' column here or the pressure will mount exponentially in the competitive East Division. Buffalo is a heavy favourite in their home opener and have the talent edge in most of the key match-ups. But the defence will have to execute at all levels, especially the pass rush, to keep this game from becoming too close for comfort. The big line makes NJ an attractive bet for fans on the fence about Buffalo's contender pedigree. Expect the Derailers to send their fans home happy, but not ecstatic. **PICK: NEW JERSEY**

ST. CHARLES @ BRUXELLES (line – BOMBERS by 6)

INJURIES: St. Charles – None; Bruxelles – None.

This pairing is now a certified prime-time rivalry after the Chargers knocked the Bombers out of first place by a point in the final week of 2018 season. Despite going on to win the Championship that year, the Chargers are not getting any love from the odds-makers as they travel across the Pond for Week Two. Jet lag always factors in a point or two when dealing with the European teams, but the spread still feels wide considering that the Chargers always play better than projected. This will attract many bettors to the underdog. But is it inconceivable that Bruxelles could knock off the reigning champs by a comfortable margin? Not really. The Bombers match up well in the secondary against Carson Wentz's favourite targets and there is enough beef in the front seven to keep Adrian Peterson and Dalvin Cook from running away with the game. Apart from a wily coach and Darius Leonard, there is not much on the Chargers' back-side to thwart Marcus Mariota and his weapons on the ground and in the air. Just a hunch, but I think the Bombers will come out with some extra pop here. **PICK: BRUXELLES**

VIRDEN @ SEATTLE (line – VIOLATORS by 11)

INJURIES: Virden – None; Seattle – None.

The Pilots put up their usual strong fight against the Cubs in Week One by getting some bell-cow action from Kareem Hunt on offence and getting lots of stops on defence. But they did give up two long TD passes to set an

early trend of breaking badly they aren't bending. The Violators, conversely, blew out the Patriots at home and looked powerful on both sides of the ball. Embarrassingly for the home team, they are double-digit underdogs here in their home opener; but given the hype around Virden's young QB, Pat Mahomes and the impressive showing by same last week, it is not surprising. The common belief seems to be that the Violators will ride the wave and down the Pilots in similar fashion here. Although I believe there is a path to victory for every team in every game, the Pilots' path is very narrow and straddled precariously over a pool of hungry piranhas; one misstep and they will be devoured. It is likely that Virden will take its foot off the gas late in the game if leading, but unlikely that will endanger the spread. **PICK: VIRDEN**

IOWA CITY @ CHARLESWOOD (line – CUBS by 2)

INJURIES: Iowa City – None; Charleswood – Marcus Gilbert (OUT).

The Pats were thoroughly trounced last week and that was surprising to many who thought they saw the makings of a competitive squad in the pre-season. It was a bad loss, regardless of how good the competition may have been on that day. But that gives them motivation to come out in their home opener with a chip on their shoulder and show that last week was an aberration. The Cubs took care of business but earned no style points in their home opener against Seattle. It is certain that they can play better and they will have to in order to escape a hungry Pats team that is certainly better than they showed last week. DeShaun Watson is waiting to break out and, while he is no Russell Wilson, he has better weapons at his disposal. Expect an "upset" that won't look like one when we look back at it later in the year. **PICK: CHARLESWOOD**

TWIN CITIES @ LOS ANGELES (line – TRIUMPH by 17)

INJURIES: Twin Cities – Jaire Alexander (OUT); Los Angeles – Vontaze Burfict (OUT).

The home opener in LA was likely never going to go the home team's way, but against the pre-season front-runner Twin Cities it is almost certain that the fans will go home depressed when this one is done. Even so, a high double-digit line this early is very aggressive and an open invitation to go with the underdog. It even tempted me for a few seconds. But a precautionary second look at the Knights' roster likely saved me from making a big mistake. Peyton Barber will not make anybody on the Triumph D-line miss and David Bakhtiari will not be able to block everybody. Guy Williams is not satisfied with his team's three-touchdown margin of victory last week and will be looking to rise in the power rankings by shellacking the Knights. Yes, it will be ugly. **PICK: TWIN CITIES**

CHINO @ PEG CITY (line – CRUSADERS by 2)

INJURIES: Chino – Kawann Short (OUT); Peg City – Chris Carson (OUT), Jerry Tillery (OUT).

Although they lost big on the scoreboard last week, the Crusaders held their own against a strong Triumph team and that is reason enough to not dismiss them in their home opener against a borderline contender like Chino. The Pegs will miss Chris Carson but hope that the tag-team of David Montgomery and Aaron Jones will pick up the slack and keep the Chino defence honest. Establishing the run to open up the play-action for Kirk Cousins is a must if the Crusaders hope to keep pace with Dak Prescott and a Chino attack that features more than one deep threat as well as an efficient short passing game to move the chains. Vegas favours the Crusaders, but it feels like the Pegs are underdogs poised to pull off an upset. They will, except, technically, it won't be. **PICK: PEG CITY**

COWTOWN @ SEBASTIAN (line – SWORDFISH by 1)

INJURIES: Cowtown – None; Sebastian – None.

The Swordfish opened the season with a soft touch, skewering the amateurish Blue Eagles without much effort. Consider it a tune-up for this important early bout against a principal rival in the North Division. The Corn Kings got 271 total yards and 3 TDs out of Todd Gurley in their road win over Durham. If they could get that production every game there would no need to discuss other aspects of the offence, like the quarterback. But as explosive as Gurley is, teams will make adjustments and, at some point, Joe Flacco will have to win a game or two. This may be one of those games. The Swordfish are stout against the run but have a soft spot in the middle of the second level. They will likely invite Flacco to test it and keep both eyes on Gurley. The Corn Kings will certainly focus on Drew Brees as their priority since nobody is sure who is running the ball in Sebastian. The pass rush will be key to knocking Brees off rhythm, but he is slippery as an eel and won't go down easily. In a near pick 'em line, take the home team. **PICK: SEBASTIAN**

SCARBOROUGH @ DURHAM (line – THUNDER LIZARDS by 1)

INJURIES: Scarborough – None; Durham – Terron Armstead (OUT), Jack Conklin (OUT), Nick Foles (OUT).

The Lizards looked a touch off in Week One, but still managed to hang in and force Cowtown to keep making plays up until the end. The fact that the Corn Kings made those plays is not a good sign for the Lizards' defence, however. Not that the Blue Eagles pose a serious offensive threat, but they have a decent running back in Jordan Howard and a good change of pace back in TJ Yeldon. A little success on the ground could go a long way to keeping this game closer than it should be. But realistically, Durham should end up walking away with the game. The only question is how long the Eagles will stick around. That will depend on who starts at QB for Durham. If Andy Dalton starts, it unravels for the Eagles in the 3rd; if Josh Allen gets the nod, the 4th. **PICK: DURHAM**

AURORA @ YORK (line – MUSTANGS by 8)

INJURIES: Aurora – Wesley Woodyard (OUT); York – Michael Johnson (DOUBTFUL), Paul Richardson Jr., (OUT).

While no blowout, Aurora's Week One win over Toronto was strong enough to convince most that they are back and ready to re-claim their rightful place on top of the South Division. York is getting little credit for their Conference title, especially after Pickering undressed them in Week One. Tom Brady looked tired, the wide receivers appeared confused and the defence performed at an asthmatic pace as the Spartans outthrustled them all day. Still, being more than a touchdown underdog in your home opener after making it to the Gale Sayers Game the year before seems a little harsh. The mystique surrounding Aurora, with a healthy JJ Watt and a rejuvenated Davante Adams-Matt Ryan connection, has cast its spell over bettors and Fantasy coaches alike. So, it is left to poor old me to blow the whistle on the victory party. The Excaliburs can be very stubborn on their home turf and, if patient on offence, can more than give the Mustangs a run for their money. A strong York run attack and play action will keep this close. **PICK: YORK**

BUDAPEST @ TORONTO (line – WOLVERINES by 1)

INJURIES: Budapest – None; Toronto – Ja'Wuan James (DOUBTFUL).

Baker Mayfield looked strong in his season debut but fans should be mindful that his accomplishments came against the warbly Hawks defence. The Wolverines' D will be a tougher test, but judging from the way Davante Adams ran circles around Jalen Ramsey last week, perhaps not the severe test it would have been last year. Fans will be watching to see how Aaron Rodgers performs against one of the better defences in the Conference. A good showing will bode well for Toronto going forward; a mediocre or poor performance will likely induce panic. Protection on

the edges will be key to Rodgers' success or failure. It doesn't have to hold up long, just long enough to give the mobile Rodgers an escape route to extend the play. Saquon Barkley will be the key to slowing down the North Stars' pass rush. This will be a close, brutal grind, with a big play either way tipping the balance. **PICK: TORONTO**

PICKERING @ GEORGIA (line – SPARTANS by 3)

INJURIES: Pickering – None; Georgia – None.

The Spartans gave their over-eager fans a reason to start booking hotels for this year's Gale Sayers Game after a Week One walloping of York. But now they start a tough three-game road trip against the win-ugly Glads that could undo all of the excitement. On paper, the match-ups favour Pickering. The Glads are susceptible to most forms of attack and the Spartans can execute all of them. The great equalizer could be Big Ben, but he will need to have his head screwed on right in the locker room before the game and get a strong showing out of Josh Jacobs if he is to catch fire. I don't have a clue who will win this game, to be honest. But I do know that Pickering hasn't proven anything yet and giving 3 points to the Glads in their home opener is a gift I can't pass up. **PICK: GEORGIA**

ERIEAU @ BROOKLIN (line – HAWKS by 7)

INJURIES: Eireau – None; Brooklin – Eli Apple (DOUBTFUL), Matt Breida (OUT).

Erieau's special power to put themselves and their opponents to sleep was on display last week in a slow-moving and forgettable loss to Georgia. Thankfully, this power wanes the farther away they are from the tranquil and nearly-empty Kelly-Burke Field. The Hawks are smarting from taking it on the chin against Budapest last week and are eager to show they, too, are a factor in the Coastal Division race. The loss of Matt Breida will hurt their chances of making this a statement-type of game. Derek Carr will be called upon to demonstrate he was worth the trade investment this off-season and he will be sorely tested by the top cornerback tandem in the league that is well-supported by an effective pass rush. He would do well to be patient. The Cadillac offence looks like it will continue to sputter and may even stand still here on the road in a hostile environment. **PICK: BROOKLIN**

FROM THE EFL ARCHIVES – The 2012 EFL Season witnessed the arrival of four expansion teams: The Twin Cities Triumph; the Sebastian Swordfish; the Mission Viejo Monarchs and the Commonwealth Colonials. It was the league's second four-team expansion and it appeared that the league had learned something from its previous mistakes as all four teams actually made to Week One intact.

The decision to run with expansion team match-ups in the Thursday night and Monday night football slots of Week One was a controversial indication of the importance

the league attached to the well-being of its nascent franchises. They would be showcased in two of the league's three most prestigious primetime slots. It was a nice gesture, but ultimately one that cost revenue as few TV sets stayed tuned past halftime to either Commonwealth's 41-17 drubbing of Mission Viejo, or Twin Cities' 31-6 mauling of Sebastian.

In a more important Week One game, the Death Valley Undertakers and LA Knights teamed up to put on the most impressive display of total offence ever witnessed in this or any other pro league. The teams combined for 1,244 and 90 points in a 49-41 Undertakers victory. **Drew Brees** set an EFL record with 620 yards passing and tied the TD pass record at the time of 7 (Brees would break that record later that year), all 7 to **Andre Johnson** to set the WR record as well. It would be the start of strange things that year in Death Valley.

After a game like that, everything else paled in comparison. But the league did note the rookie debuts of two top QB selections from the draft: Pickering's **RGIII** and Mohave's **Andrew Luck**. The former led his team to a narrow 17-14 win over the Corn Kings while the latter struggled in a 42-0 Mohave blowout loss to York.
