IOWA CITY – It was a beautiful day in Iowa City, 52 degrees with very little wind. Two teams fighting for playoff contention took the field in a pivotal contest. The teams' coaches are no strangers to each other. Dave Birdsall of Gwinnett and Iowa City's Deron Redding are long time rivals whose past head to head contests have never been short on drama. In fact, these two long-time managers once squared off in a championship game in 2003 while members of the SFL.

This was a tale of two halves. Iowa City ruled the first half, but Gwinnett came out strong and dominated the second. Willie Parker rebounded from a sluggish first half to pick up Game MVP honors, finishing with 146 yards on 32 carries with 3 touchdowns. Willie also snared 7 passes for 53 yards. Each team overcame 9 penalties apiece to take this one down to the last half minute of play. Casey Hampton admitted in postgame interviews that he overloaded on coffee before the game and it resulted in numerous offsides infractions.

The game started off well for the Cubs as they scored on their opening drive when JP Losman hit Ronnie Brown for a 15-yard touchdown to make it 7-0. After a Robbie Gould field goal cut the lead to 7-3, the Gladiators' Nate Burluson returned a punt 85 yards, down to the Cubs' 1! Willie Parker dived across the goalline on 1st down to make it 10-7 Gwinnett, ending the opening frame. The Cubs offense posted 16 unanswered points in the second quarter to help build a 23-10 halftime lead, and looked to be in total control of the Gladiator back-siders. However, the Gwinnett 'D' stabilized in the third quarter, temporarily holding off Losman's crew and setting up a dramatic fourth quarter in which the lead changed hand three times.

On the final and eventual game-winning drive, the Glads, who had struggled all day on third down, moved 52 yards in 6 plays, never facing third down along the way, and finished with 5-yard sweep by Willie Parker to the right pylon for the major.

It was Parker, who rang up '6' three times while rushing for 146 yards, and the Gwinnett return men, Nate Burluson (85-yard return to set up a TD) and Terrence McGee (31.6 average on kick returns), who kept putting the Glads in position to score and keep pace with the red hot Cub's offense.

Meanwhile, on the Cubs side, the loss wiped out an extremely effective performance by the Cub's pass-catch team of Losman to Evans. Lee Evans caught 10 passes, a season high, for 126 yards, while Losman completed 71% of his passes for 295 yards and 2 TDS without an interception or a sack.

FRANK GORE AND PHILIP RIVERS LEAD 466-YARD OFFENSIVE DISPLAY

DURHAM – In a battle of green scaly mythical creatures, the Florida Dragons flew to Durham to take on the Thunder Lizards. As the T-Lizards have done all season they took the opening kick off and easily moved down the field, culminating the drive with a one-yard scoring plunge by Justin Griffith. Florida answered with a twenty-four yard Nugent FG and the first quarter came to a close with Durham up 7-3. The Thunder Lizards' offense continued to hum, moving at will against the southern lizards, but two fumbles deep in Florida territory, one by Frank "Dino" Gore and another by Kevin Faulk, kept this one from quickly getting away from Dragons. It was a temporary reprieve, however, as Florida could not get anything going on offense, leaving Durham with good field position which turned into an additional 10 points and a 17-3 half time lead.

As the teams headed off to their respective locker rooms a portable stage was wheeled out to mid field and Celine Dion, clad in a green dragon costume, came crashing out of a dinosaur egg and began to sing Leonard Lipton and Peter Yarrow's "Puff the Magic Dragon" under a dazzling display of fireworks which burst overhead and what sounded like blood curdling cries of pain from the Durham locker room. Dion finished her rendition of the song made popular by Peter, Paul and Mary and waddled off the stage to the thunderous ovation of twelve long haired baby boomers in town for the Cannabis Freedom movement.

This display was enough to drive most media and visiting fans out of the park and the rest of the game went untelevised. Reports from the brave few media who stayed indicate that Durham held off a third quarter rally by the Dragons to run away with it in the fourth quarter.

OPPORTUNISTIC CORN KINGS KNOCK OFF GOLDEN BEARS

*EARLY KUTZTOWN TURNOVERS KICK START
COWTOWN'S OFFENSE*

COWTOWN – The game could not have started much worse than it did for the Kutztown Golden Bears. After shutting down Cowtown on their first possession, Bear return man Allen Rossum, trying to get a little extra yardage on a

15-yard return, coughed up the ball when he was clobbered by rookie Justin Durant. Sean Considine fell on it on the 38-yard line and the Corn Kings suddenly had a second opportunity to score first. They took advantage five plays later when tall tight end, Matt Spaeth, caught a short hitch from Chad Pennington and lumbered into the end zone for a 7-0 lead.

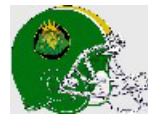
Early troubles continued for Kutztown on their first offensive possession of the game. After opening with 12 and 20-yard completions to Marvin Harrison and a 12-yard scamper by Larry Johnson to bring them into Cowtown territory, fortune suddenly turned sour for Romo and Co. when Walt Harris picked off his second pass of the season, returning it 44 yards to the Kutztown 31-yard line. A clutch third down conversion by Marion Barber on a 13-yard short pass set up a first-and-goal at the ten. From there it took three plays for the Corn Kings to punch it into the end zone, the final a 3-yard pitch to Laurence Maroney for a 14-0 lead.

A highlight reel play on the Golden Bear's next possession finally put them in position to put some points on the board – Romo found Plaxico Burrese open over the middle for 10-yard pass, but as he was being hauled down by two defenders, Burrese lateralled the ball to a trailing Marvin Harrison, who sprinted for another 45 yards to bring the ball

to the Cowtown 12 yard line and set up a Nate Kaeding field goal. The Bears would add a TD after a dominating 15-play, 86-yard drive, but Cowtown would add a late field goal after a nice 25-yard punt return by Mewelde Moore set a short drive to close the half.

The Corn Kings held on to a 24-13 lead late in the fourth quarter, when Romo somehow found Eddie Kennison open deep in a sea of green and yellow defenders for a 40-yard TD pass to close the gap.

With a precarious 4-point lead to protect, Chad Pennington managed a game-clinching 77 yard drive that ended, somewhat controversially, with a 10-yard touchdown pass to Mike Furrey. With Kutztown out of timeouts, the Corn Kings could have run out the clock with 1:23 left, but instead elected to throw a risky pass.

Coach Coghlin addressed this after the game with a deer-in-the-headlights expression on his face. "They had no timeouts left???"

LOS ANGELES – It is a tough day for a young rookie quarterback when he is asked to step into the middle of a defensive slugfest and keep his team ahead in the 4th quarter in a one-point game. It is an even tougher day when he is asked to throw against one of the top defenses in the league on a day when they are performing well.

It was indeed a tough day for Tavaris Jackson, whose first pass in relief of a shaken up David Carr was picked off by Pats line-backer, David Harris and run back 30 yards to his team's 12 yard line. Peyton Manning, frustrated all day by a tough Knights defense, made no mistake on the next play, hitting Chad Johnson on hitch route for *Ocho Cinco*'s first TD of the season, and the only TD of the day for Charleswood, to give the visitors a 12-7 lead.

ANCHORAGE – Marc Bulger picked apart the Buccaneers secondary when he needed to make a play, racking up 285 yards passing and 2 touchdowns on the way to a 41-17 victory.

The Hellfire defense kept Drew Brees contained for most of the game, letting up only once when the Bucs' pivot found Randy Moss open 41 yards downfield for a 1st quarter touchdown pass.

Despite trouble maintaining consistency on offense, the Bucs found themselves down by only 3 points entering the 4th quarter. But the final frame belonged to Mohave, starting with a 19-yard TD pass from Bulger to Laveranues Coles, and ending with 14 points coming off of two Brees interceptions.

CONVICTS ESCAPE AS YOUNG LEADS LATE BREAKOUT TO BEAT MEADOWLANDS

SWAMP DOGS HOUND CUTLER / RUN FROM YOUNG

CHINO – Making his first EFL start, Convict quarterback Jay Cutler threw 2 first quarter TD passes but then found himself “dogged” by an aggressive Meadowlands’ pass rush that smelled rookie fear. Cutler was sacked five times, fumbling on each, and made two costly turnovers that lead to 2 Meadowlands touchdowns, keeping what should have been an easy game uncomfortably close.

Protecting a shaky 7-point lead early in the fourth quarter, Cutler was sacked on his own five-yard line by DeMarcus Ware, who forced a fumble that was recovered by teammate Gary Brackett. Three plays later, Jason Campbell found Chris Chambers open across the middle of the end zone for the tying score.

With impatient Convict Nation turning nasty at the thought of losing to the league’s only winless team, Chino coach, Rob Nazar made the switch to Vince

Young at a crucial point in the closing stages of the game. Facing 4th down and one at the Swamp Dogs’ 46-yard line with 6:44 remaining, Nazar kept the offense on the field but sent Young in to take the snap. With the Swampies ‘D’ looking for Chino star halfback, LT, Young ran the bootleg around the left side for an electrifying 20-yard gain. Young stayed in the game and moved the offense down the field the rest of the way, finally connecting with Anquan Boldin from 10 yards out for what would turn out to be the game-winning touchdown.

The Swamp Dogs, who had never been within one score of an opponent in the fourth quarter in any of their previous 8 games, found themselves in an unfamiliar situation – needing to put together a late touchdown drive to tie the game. They went for it all at once, sending both wide-outs on deep fly patterns. Young Jason Campbell couldn’t decide who to throw to and was sacked by Mark Anderson to put the Swampies back on their heels. That shaky play was followed up by two straight incompletions and a punt. The Young-led Convicts never gave the ball back to Meadowlands, and the home team hung to win the game.

Although the Convicts controlled the overall play of the game and out-gained the Swamp Dogs by a 2-1 margin, the inspired play of Meadowlands’ linebacker, DeMarcus Ware helped to give his team their best opportunity to win a game so far this season. Ware had 4 sacks and 4 forced fumbles and forced the Convicts to account for him on every passing play. Had it not been, perhaps, for Adam “Pacman” Jones’ 87-yard punt return for a touchdown, Ware and the Swamp Dogs might have had a kinder fate.

JIMMY'S WEEK TEN PICKS

GAME OF THE WEEK

CHARLESWOOD @ MOHAVE (LINE – HELLFIRE BY 2)

The last time these two powerhouses met, Charleswood rebounded from a 16-0 halftime deficit to make a game of it, but could not finish the comeback when Manning failed to crack the Hellfire 'Quarter' pass package. That means that Mohave, like other good teams, can stop the league's best quarterback. So the Patriots will have to get Manning's "A" game, or keep the Hellfire honest by running the ball effectively. That might be a problem against the league's most efficient run defense. Charleswood is having trouble scoring lately, 13 points and 12 points in their past two games, a problem not shared by their opponent. GWINNETT @ MEADOWLANDS (LINE – GLADIATORS BY 6)

The Dawgs are completely stuck in the muck. Their offense continues to be astonishingly bad and none of their many game-day coaches seems to have a solution. The defense will have to win one if they are going to win at all this year, but until they actually win one, I cannot see how they can win one, even at home against a team that is struggling on the road.

The league's hottest 3-6 team hosts the league's other 3-6 team in a battle to see which will be the first to improve to 4-6. The Bucs won the last match-up, but much has changed since Week Two. Carr has shown he can move the ball against the weaker defenses and the Knight's defense is establishing itself as one of the EFL's best. Drew Brees has been inconsistent and the Bucs defense is setting records for ineptitude. The Anchorage offensive line will have its hands full handling the Knight's pass rush, so Brees will have to get rid of the ball quickly and into his receiver's hands to take some of the heat off. There will be no rookie QB starting this game for Chino, as Donovan McNabb, who torched Durham for 381 passing yards in Week Two, is well-rested and itching to get another shot at the T-Lizard’s secondary. LaDainian Tomlinson will ensure that McNabb gets his shots down field, motivated by his keen desire to knock rival Frank Gore from the top of the rushing leader board. As for “Dino-Gore,” he is looking more and more like a human-reptilian hybrid out of a science fiction flick – freakish and awesome and unstoppable by normal human means. Durham’s other weapons – Philip Rivers and a solid receiving corps led by tight end, Antonio Gates – are almost mundane by comparison, but all the more effective because of it. In Jurassic Park, with its demoralizing heat and humidity and horrifying half time shows, the Convicts will need more than a prayer.

After shocking Mohave in the desert in Week eight, they came within 1 point of beating Gwinnett last week in a game they largely controlled. One of their upsets this year was in Week Two against the very same Corn Kings they face this week, and the Niblet Monarchs from the One Cow Town have not forgotten that game. It remains a black mark on their record and the reason, they believe, they do not currently share first place in the West Division with their hated Durham rivals. Cowtown will be looking for revenge, and the fact that the Cubs have playoff hopes at stake will make their revenge all the more sweet. *IF* they can pull it off! Iowa City really is performing at a high level, especially on offense, while the Corn Kings are kind of muddling through lately. They will need a big day from the defense and an efficient day from Chad Pennington to knock off the Cubs at Joe Ferguson Stadium. Either that, or J.P. Losman will have to remember who he is.
