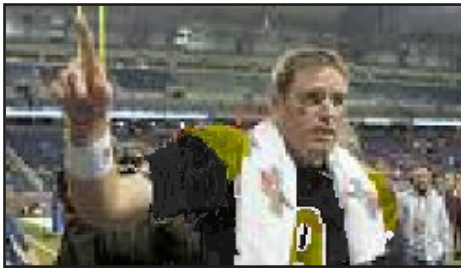

PALMER RALLIES GLADIATORS, KNOCKS OFF MANNING'S PATRIOTS *TD PASS IN FINAL MINUTE SCORES UPSET IN GAME OF THE WEEK*

GWINNETT - The Charleswood Patriots traveled to a rainy Gwinnett County, Georgia for the Gladiators' inaugural home opener. Despite the wet weather, excitement was in the air as players and fans pumped themselves up for the real season.

Many pundits feel that the Pats, lead by Peyton Manning, are the team to beat in the EFL. The home town Gladiators and their fans think differently. They have a quarterback too – and his name is Carson Palmer – but more on him later.

As game time approached, the highly touted Pats looked ready to take their place as the EFL's Team. Although he

did not give a pre-game interview to the press, it was a relaxed-looking Coach Findlay, wearing a grey-hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans, who winked for the cameras as he took the field at the Gwinnett Coliseum. His quarterback, Peyton Manning, warmed up casually on the sidelines, taking time to joke with back-up, Brian Griese and center, Brad Meester. On the Gwinnett sideline, it was all business, as Carson Palmer stood away from the bench talking earnestly to QB coach, Steve Bartkowksi. Was he focusing or just uptight?

Although scheduled for a 9:00 pm ET start, the 2-hour long pre-game ceremonies, including chariot races and mock gladiatorial combat, went overtime when a lion got loose on the field, pushing kickoff back to 9:30. When the teams finally took the field, both offenses had to shake off the rust, exchanging punts on their first possessions. The Patriots moved the ball 49 yards on their next possession, but kicker Stephen Gostkowski missed a 35-yard FG attempt that would have given his team the early lead. At the end of the first quarter the game was scoreless, but the Gladiators were slowly winning the field position battle.

As the first quarter came to a close, the Gladiators got the ball at the Patriots' 42 yard line. An 8-play drive, keyed by a 20-yard pass to tight end, Tony Gonzalez, was capped off by a quick 3-yard slant from Palmer to Darrell Jackson for the first score of the game and the first TD in Gwinnett's brief franchise history. The home crowd went crazy and the cheering carried over into the ensuing kickoff, reaching rock concert decibels when Patriots return man, Wes Welker fumbled the ball away on his own 23-yard line.

Determined to not let the game get out of hand, the Patriots 'D' stiffened inside the 5-yard line, and the Glads had to settle for a chip shot 26-yard FG by Robbie Gould to make the score 10-0 Gwinnett.

On his next possession, Manning found success through the air, hitting 3 straight passes for a total of 58 yards to set up an Adrian Peterson 11-yard run to the Gwinnett 2 yard line. Then it became the Gladiators turn to tighten up, knocking Thomas Jones backwards 3 yards on 2 carries and stoning Peterson on 3rd down. Needing a score to salvage something, the Patriots opted for the field goal, finally putting them on the board, but trailing 10-3.

Anxious, perhaps too anxious, to rebuild the two score cushion his team had enjoyed, Palmer tried to force a long throw to Reggie Wayne through 5 defensive backs. The last one, Ed Reed, picked it off and returned it to his own 34. But that first Gwinnett turnover was immediately followed by the second Charleswood turnover, as Peyton Manning threw into a crowd on the very next play and Dunta Robinson, (who had refused Dave Birdsall's contract extension offer before breaking camp this year) picked it off and returned it to Charleswood's 36 yard line. With a chance to redeem himself, Palmer hit Darrell Jackson for 19 yards on a straight route to enter the Charleswood red zone. But two plays later, it was Ed Reed again, sitting on a slant route, who snatched a Palmer pass intended for Gonzalez and ran it back 92 yards for the Patriots first ever TD.

With the score deadlocked at 10 apiece, both teams went to their locker rooms to regroup. It had been a jittery first half for both teams, the kind of game that makes both coaches uncomfortable and superstitious. Had Gwinnett squandered the momentum? Was the Patriot offense going to wake up? Would the half time celebrations, involving a re-enactment of Russell Crowe's 'Gladiator,' *ever end*?

The Patriot offense certainly looked awake on their first possession of the second half, marching 92 yards on 13 plays, capped by a 1-yard plunge by Thomas Jones for Charleswood's first offensive TD of the season. Having the lead for the first time all night, the Patriots suddenly looked on top of the world and the Gladiators and their fans looked deflated.

Strangely, Charleswood could not press home their advantage. Their offense stalled repeatedly and finally the Glads scraped together enough offense to post a fieldgoal at the start of the fourth quarter to pull within 4 points, trailing 17-13. Back and forth went both teams without reward until finally, with 4 minutes remaining in the game, Gwinnett took possession at their own 23 yard line and began what some fans and writers are simply calling, "The Drive."

With the Patriots sitting back on the pass and not bringing pressure to bear, Palmer connected on 4 of 5 passes and Willie Parker and Leon Washington busted big runs of 14 and 17 yards to bring the Gladiators to the Charleswood 18 yard line with 40 seconds remaining in the game. Needing a touchdown or nothing else, Palmer wasted no time going straight for the throat, hitting Darrell Jackson as he pulled away from Quentin Jammer across the middle and ran the final 5 yards untouched into the endzone for his second TD, and the winning score.

Manning got one final try after Wes Welker brought the kick back to the Charleswood 41, but it was anti-climactic. Two wildly overthrown passes that missed Chad Johnson by a mile and two sacks ended the attempted comeback, and the first ever EFL game for both these teams was in the books.

BY THE NUMBERS: The two highly rated QB's had poor ratings: Manning was 16-30 for a 60.0 rating and Palmer was 14-30 for a 60.4. Willie Parker had 97 yards to lead rushers while Pats Chad Johnson had 120 yards receiving. Glad Rookie Gaines Adams made his presence felt with two key sacks in the 4th quarter and Pats Safety, All-World, Ed Reed had the two picks. One other stat worth mentioning was Glads' punter Dave Zastudil who had 4 of his 5 punts downed inside the 20 to continually force the Pats to start with poor field position.

including once in the red zone. Tailback Marshawn Lynch, drafted in the 1st round from California, also contributed heavily, spelling Brian Westbrook often in the second half and scoring an insurance touchdown.

Both offenses found the going quite rough in the first half. Perhaps it was the stifling heat, recorded at 108 degrees on the field, opening day jitters, or plain old rust. Regardless, neither team could get out of first gear very much before the break.

After getting a short field goal to open the second half, Mohave got the break they needed about six minutes in when Westbrook broke lose on 3rd and six from the MOH 20 and wasn't hauled down for 76 yards! Marc Bulger connected with Laveranues Coles on the next play for only the second touchdown of the game for either team and the Hellfire led 17-6.

The Dragons offense simply could not keep up. Running back, Steven Jackson did not put it together until the fourth quarter and Tom Brady could not make up the difference, finishing with 154 yards passing and a game day QB rating of 50.5.

Hellfire MVP, Brian Westbrook, rushed for 132 yards and racked up another 59 yards and a TD in the air for a total of 191 yards. Marc Bulger added 3 TD passes and 224 yards.

**CORN KINGS RUN
DRYDOCKED BUCS INTO
THE GROUND**

COWTOWN – Three running backs, all competing for the starter’s job in pre-season, combined for 239 yards on 27 carries to lead a dominating offensive performance by the Corn Kings. “Just call us Cerebrus,” said Jerious Norwood, referring to the mythical 3-headed dog that guarded the gates of Hell. “You

can take one of us out of the game but the other two will make you pay.” Norwood sparked the home team with a dramatic 71-yard TD run to score the first points of the year for Cowtown. On the day, Norwood had 102 yards on 5 carries, while his hellhound partners, Marion Barber and Laurence Maroney, posted 78 yards and 59 yards respectively.

Not to be overlooked, the Corn Kings’ defense smothered the vaunted Anchorage offense, limiting Drew Brees to 97 yards passing and the entire team to 162 net yards of offense. Brees faced pressure all day, getting sacked 4 times and hurried 3 times, but avoided throwing an interception. Chad Pennington had a fine day, posting a 103.8 game day passer rating and making things happen with his feet, scrambling for 36 yards to keep a couple of drives alive. Except for two turnovers, a fumble and an interception, it was a perfect Home Opener for Cowtown.

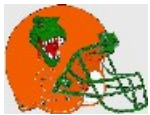

The Cubs battled back to tie it up before Durham delivered the knockout field goal in the extra session. But the story could easily have been very different.

The drama of this game really began with 1:13 remaining and the game tied 17-17. Iowa City took over possession on their own 20 and marched down the field in 8 plays to the Durham 18. Garcia spiked the ball with 6 seconds left on the clock to set up Playboy Neil for the potential game winning kick, a very makeable 35-yarder. As the Nature Boy booted it, you could hear a pin drop in Joe Ferguson Stadium. The kick was "wide left! Wide left!"

After the Thunder Lizards kicked off out of bounds to start the additional stanza, the Cubs looked poised to redeem themselves and give the fans something to shout about (and, let's face it, get drunk about...we're talking Iowa City here). Facing a 4th and 7 at the Durham 36, Coach Redding once again summoned his kicker to get the job done. Rackers hooked the kick wide left and it wouldn't have mattered due to a holding penalty on the Cubs. The Thunder Lizards took over and rammed the ball down Iowa City's throats with 7 straight runs. Scobee came on to drill the 31-yard game winner and the Thunder Lizards moved to 1-0 on the young season.

Game MVP Phillip Rivers was dialed in all game long as he threw for 215 yards and 2 scores. Frank Gore rushed for 171 yards on 29 carries and tallied another 34 receiving on 3 grabs. Turnovers and penalties almost did the visiting Thunder Lizards in, but solid coaching by Coach George Kaldis prevented the defeat. 9 different receivers caught passes for Durham! The Thunder Lizards' special teams clearly outplayed the Cubs' unit in all facets.

For the Cubs, Reggie Bush and Jeff Garcia led the way. Bush ran for 77 yards and a touchdown and caught 9 passes for 75 yards. Garcia went 28 of 46 for 281. Neil Rackers went 1 for 3 on the day, missing 2 game-winning kicks, and was seen thrust kicking a hole in the wall of the brand new clubhouse after the game.
